



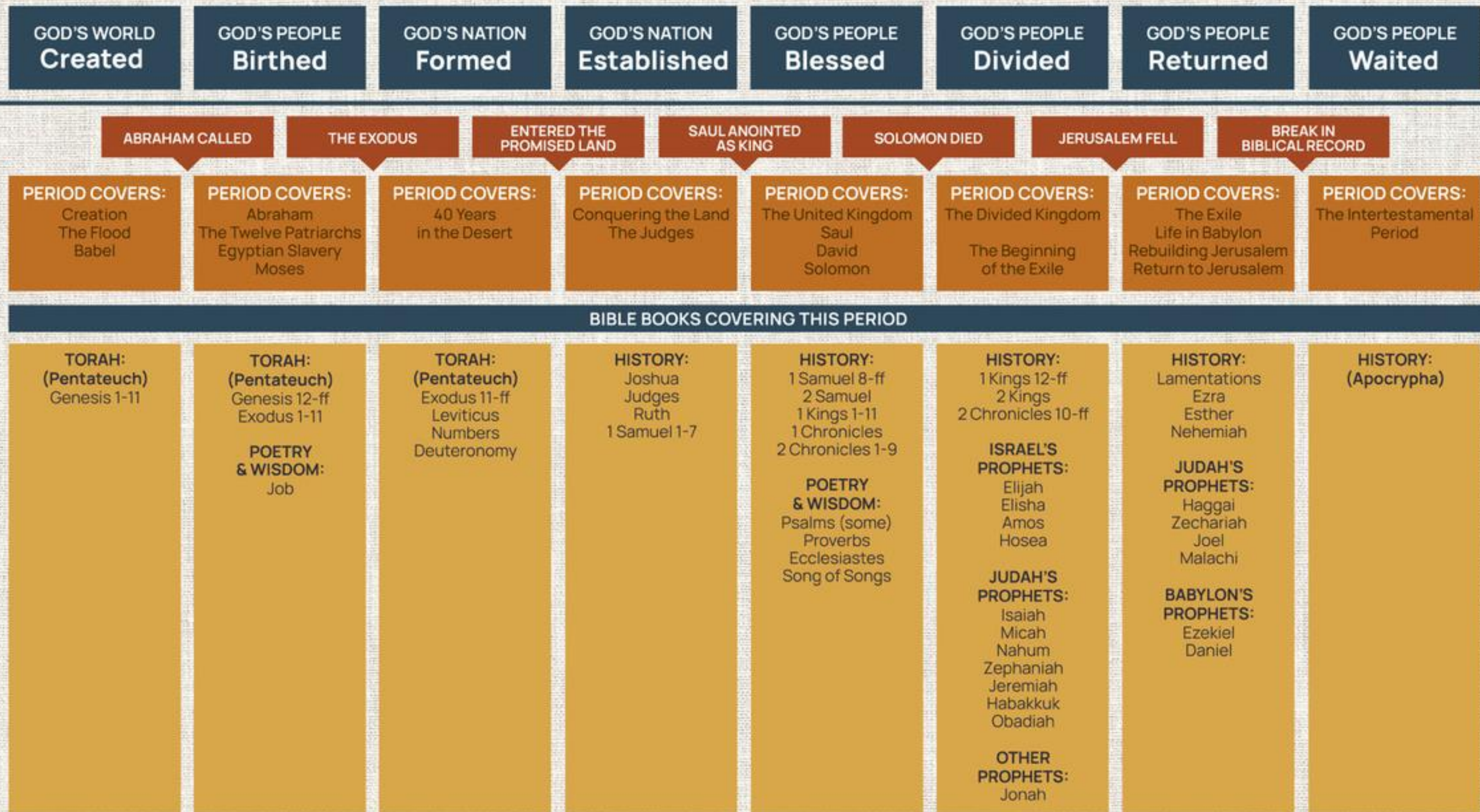

A DIVIDED KINGDOM: JUDAH'S PROPHETS

BEGINNING WITH A RECAP

- ❖ Israel was divided into northern and southern kingdoms after the United Kingdom under Saul, David, and Solomon.
- ❖ From 930 to ~724BC, the northern kingdom(Israel) had 20 Kings who led them to ultimate captivity by the Assyrians.
- ❖ Prophets were sent to warn and encourage, but they did not change-that is 200yrs
- ❖ The southern kingdom(Judah) also had 20 kings but lasted 136 years longer before their exile to Babylon.
- ❖ Today, we will look at Judah's prophets-2 of them; Habakkuk and Micah

CONTINUING WITH THE WORD

Habakkuk - A Dialogue with YHWH just before the rise of the Babylonian Empire

Habakkuk, the prophet, struggles to understand the extent of wickedness in his surroundings and complains to God.

Hab 1:2-4 - He questions God about the injustice he sees.

Hab 1:5-11 - Habakkuk is dissatisfied with God's initial response.

Hab 1:12-15- He presses YHWH for further clarification.

God answers -Hab 2:2-5, 12-16, 18-20, reassuring Habakkuk that wickedness will not go unpunished.

Hab 3:2-6, 11-15, 17-19-Habakkuk responds with a beautifully

Micah – He condemns idolatry, corrupt leadership and provides hope for the future

He predicts the fall of Samaria and Jerusalem, capital cities of Israel and Judah

Micah 1:6-7,9-Samaria and Jerusalem will be destroyed

Micah 2:6-7, 11- false prophets

Micah 3:1-3- corrupt leadership

Micah 3:12 – the judgement that awaits Judah

Micah 5:2,4-5- a day is coming when this punishment will end and peace will reign
