BEGINNING WITH A RECAP

- ❖ Very first exile in Genesis 3, Adam and Eve; Gen 4-Cain
- ❖ Israel finds themselves in Babylon, a foreign land —exile
- The whole bible addresses this issue
- * Exile is a biblical condition-separation from God due to sin
- Yearning for restoration, a sense of belonging, and a way to return home.
- Hope for redemption after disobedience and displacement
- o Psalm 137 speaks to how the Israelites were feeling



- The Babylonians took the Israelites as prisoners
- Daniel offers insights into how to live like exiles
- ❖ Minority in a foreign land, new culture and new gods
- Some revolted, some gave in and adopted the Babylonian gods
- Are these our only options?
- Jeremiah –live life, seek the well-being of Babylon, pray to God for them; don't revolt or compromise.
- ❖ Daniel's story gives us the template for living in this tension



- Daniel and his friends were chosen to work in the king's palace.
- Took Babylonians' names and clothing styles-did they succumb?
- ❖ Dan 3:12-18-they would not give in to Nebuchadnezzar
- They served Babylon and sought its well-being but were faithful to YHWH



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- ❖ Dan 2:43-45-Daniel interprets Nebuchadnezzar's dream
- The kingdom of God, which the church is a part, was foretold by Daniel
- Daniel served the king but did not compromise-Dan 6:13-16;19-21

- ❖ Dan 12:13- one day, an inheritance will be rewarded
